Registration Deadline: Friday, August 2, 2024

Full or half payment is due on August 2nd. After that, payment is due within two weeks of confirmation. For half payment, the second 50% of payment is due Jan 17th.

Multi-Child Discount: For families with 3 or more children ages 4-17, a \$20 discount will be applied per child.

To off-set our non-profit's credit card fees, please consider paying by check.

Cancellation policy: Refunds will be issued up to two weeks before the start date of the school year minus a \$50 administrative fee. If cancellation occurs after this time, a 50% refund of the pro-rated remaining sessions will be issued. Full refunds are only given for medical reasons and family emergencies.

Waitlist: Waitlists will be formed when groups have reached their capacity or if a child is registered mid-season. Before the beginning of the winter and spring session, we will attempt to add more students into groups if there are spaces available.

TADPOLES 0-3 YEARS

Playgroup meets once a month, 1:30-3:00pm

DRAGONFLIES 4K-K

FALL:

IN THE TALL GRASS: Learn the difference between grasses and flowers and look for the insects that make up a prairie.

TOWERING TREES: Meet the many kinds of trees at Riveredge and search for the animals that use them.

QUEST: ANIMAL HOMES: Let's go on a den hunt! Find out what animals are using Riveredge as a home.

WINTER:

UNDER THE ICE: Who's still swimming under the water in winter? Together, we'll drill into the ice to find out!

INTO THE EVERGREENS: Experiment with evergreens to find out why they stay green and find the animals that use them for shelter.

QUEST: ROMP TO THE RIVER: Rivers are an important place for water and food in winter. Let's hike to look for signs of river users.

SPRING:

LIFE UNDER LOGS: Dead logs are full of life! Let's get rolling and find out who uses a log as a home. EXPLORING VERNAL POND: With scooper in hand, we'll dive into the unique habitat that is a vernal pond.

QUEST: HELP THOSE HABITATS! Learn what we can do to help protect native animals and plants.

MONARCHS AND HAWKS 1ST-2ND, 3RD-4TH GRADE

FALL:

FOREST DETECTIVES: Study the secret lives of animals and plants to discover how they shape the forests around us.

PRAIRIE PIONEERS: Learn why tallgrass prairies are so important and how their use has changed with time.

QUEST: NATIVE CONNECTIONS: Discover the useful plants of Riveredge and their importance to indigenous people.

WINTER:

WEATHER WATCHERS: Conduct experiments and observations to study the patterns of wild winter weather.

UNDER THE ICE: What happens underneath the ice after a pond freezes over?

QUEST: RIVEREDGE RUINS: Uncover the HIstory behind the mysterious riverside ruins at Riveredge.

SPRING:

EPHEMERAL SPRING: Investigate vernal pools, wildflowers, and migrating birds.

BIOBLITZ: BIODIVERSITY MATTERS! Discover how all living things are connected in the web of life and help keep count of Riveredge's diverse plants and animals.

QUEST: HABITAT HEALING: Practice caring for wild habitats through project-based learning.

STURGEON

5TH-7TH GRADE

FALL:

LAND MANAGEMENT: Study prairie fires, remove invading plants and help protect the land while investigating our human impact.

WINTER:

FOCUS ON FORESTS: Learn how to identify trees, map the forest, check up on tree health, and size up trees for human use.

SPRING:

CITIZEN SCIENCE: Become a nature scientist and teach younger students how to care for habitats.

COYOTES

8TH-12TH GRADE

FALL:

WISCONSIN'S GLACIAL ECOLOGY: Study the impact of the Ice Age on WI's past and present.

WINTER:

WINTER ECOLOGY: Learn how plants and animals survive this challenging season.

SPRING:

EARLY PEOPLE OF WISCONSIN: Explore the cultures of Indigneous Americans and the mapmaking of early pioneers.
